#### Paulina Kay

Author Paulina Kay is the founder of Kay Consulting and a former corporate communications and public relations professional. In her new book, True Joy



for the Retired: A Holistic Approach to Spreading the Love to our Forgotten Elderly she shares her experiences and the importance of transgenerational relationships in our modern times. Paulina grew up in Mexico enjoying the stories of struggles and success her father and grandmother would share with her. She hopes that through her book, she can help us reconnect and truly appreciate and relish the gift of

love, joy, and wisdom earlier generations have so generously given to us. Paulina believes that the stories of the past can be a gift that helps us walk through our difficult moments in life.

#### Alma Tucker

Alma Tucker is the Founder and President of the nonprofit organization International Network of Hearts (INH) and the Mexico counterpart, Red



Binacional de Corazones. She received her graduate degree in clinical psychology from the University Center of Technical and Superior Education (CETYS) in Baja California, Mexico. Alma worked as an investigative officer for the Child Protection Unit with the Mexican Consulate General based in San Diego for more than ten years. She has more than 15 years of experience assisting victims of abuse and human trafficking. Her organization, INH, is a nonprofit based in San Diego that supports survivors of human trafficking and provides training and education at an

interdisciplinary and bi-national level. They also established the only group home in Baja California designed for young boys and girls recovering from human trafficking, called Casa del Jardín.

### Conference Rules and Procedures April 29-30, 2022

- 1. The voting body at this conference shall consist of members of the District Eleven Board of Directors; regularly accredited delegates from clubs within the District; and Past Governors, holding active membership in their respective local Altrusa Clubs or who are affiliate members. Members of the voting body shall have one vote on each question to come before the assembly. No person is entitled to more than one vote. (District Bylaws, Article VI, Section 7)
- 2. A majority of the members who are entitled to vote shall constitute a quorum and the act of the majority of members at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the members of the District. (District Bylaws, Article VI, Section 6)
- 3. Only voting members may introduce motions and vote, but all non-voting members shall be allowed the privilege of speaking to a motion.
- 4. Each member has the right to speak twice on the subject, but may not make a second speech on the subject as long as any other member who has not spoken desires to speak on it. Debate is limited to two minutes per speech.
- 5. Debate must remain germane to the Motion.
- 6. Speakers must direct their debate through the Chair. An individual must identify themselves by name and club prior to speaking.
- 7. Upon the making and seconding of a motion, the maker of the motion shall email the motion to the District Governor and District Secretary.

- 8. A motion may be withdrawn while pending if general consent of the voting body is given.
- 9. The latest edition of Robert's Rule of Order, Newly Revised, will be the Parliamentary Authority. The parliamentarian interprets meeting rules and advises the presiding officer of parliamentary procedure.




