educational journey.



About our August meeting......



Around ten years ago while we still met at a restaurant it was decided to form Buddy Groups. Initially they were designed around who was sitting at your table that evening. The idea was to get to know each other better and become the support system for new members. These groups would stay in communication with each other and maybe even do social things together.

Then came COVID and we all became isolated from regular meetings. The restaurant we met at closed and we came to depend upon Zoom if we could even meet that way. It was a tough time for clubs and trying to communicate became even more important. For some it was an easy transition but for others learning this new technique was very difficult

Once we were able to meet in person again it was almost impossible to find a place to meet at. We did find one place and that allowed us to have meetings in a hybrid fashion. Some chose to attend in person while others opted to use Zoom.

Buddy Groups became even more important when this occurred so that if you missed a meeting your group could fill you in on what happened before the minutes came out. Minutes became part of the President's agenda packet rather than sent our prior.

Each new President sets up the Buddy Groups for the biennium. An effort is made to mix the groups up but still having the new member and their sponsor together. Communication is still important plus the presiding President can send out information to the Buddy Leads rather than to individual members via a group mailing. We found out that many of those emails were missed due to the number of email addresses.

We use the Buddy Groups to work together on service projects and on fundraisers now and even to bring in snacks or maybe a meal at our social time prior to our meetings.

Most importantly if using Buddy Groups isn't your thing please let our club President know. If you have a better way please share it. This is what works for now but this club is flexible enough to at least try something else.


BOOK ends
